How An Afternoon At The Museum Equals \$10,000

Three scholarly minds from "With A Little Help...", Inc. descended on the Milwaukee Public Museum Saturday, participating in the Quest For The Lost Hour- a scavenger hunt event coinciding with the expiration of Daylight Savings Time. Led by the lovely and talented Samantha Donoghue, the team searched, scoured, and sifted through four floors of the museum in a frantic chase against several other teams. The goal? A grand prize contribution to the charity of their choice.

In the end, With A Little Help's team of Samantha, Scott Uhlman, and Patrick Donoghue were the second team to finish- and the only team to answer all clues correctly- securing the contribution of \$10,000.

The Quest began weeks ago with a series of 12 online riddles. They referenced numerous different articles and areas on the organization's website, and included Vigenere ciphers- which were once thought unbreakable, and variants of which are still in use in intelligence operations today.

WALH's team was one of only three in the Milwaukee area to solve all twelve online clues, which qualified them for the final contest and earned them a time advantage versus the other teams involved.

On the day of the final, WALH's team was the first to arrive, and scouted the territory. None of the clues involved the museum's current The Scoop On Poop exhibit- "The #1 exhibit on #2"- so this ruled out one section of one floor, but three floors and part of the basement's worth of territory still needed to be covered.



The Davinci-Code-style game involved searching exhibits about archaeology, the rainforest, Central American cultures, Aztec calendars, a centuries-old section of a fallen tree, and several others. Teams were given the clues, a bag of tools, and a two-hour time limit for the final round. In the tool pouch was a cipher-solving wheel, pencil, ice pack, and hourglass. Some riddles involved reading text in the exhibit and interpreting the text into something that the clue asked for. Others referred the players to something else, and still other solutions referred the player back to the clue itself- such as an answer printed on the back of the page in UV ink or ink that reacts to cold. Finding the answer printed in UV ink required teams to track down a specific staff member who held a UV light used to scan wristbands.

In the end, WALH's team was announced the winner, and let out an enthusiastic cry. They took home the donation as well as a prestigious gold-painted garden gnome trophy, and "With A Little Help...", Inc. made a name for itself amongst this crowd of code-crackers.
